A You are always on task. C You are on task more often than not. **You generally speak only when called upon and are not prepared to discuss topics in detail or with substance.** You hesitate to share ideas and you may even stray from the assigned task. You may not bring appropriate materials to class and you sometimes come to class late. Your written and oral comments in peer review and self reflection show some thought but lack depth. You do not regularly take an active role in your own learning. You are late with assignments..
